# TRES DIAS SECRETARIAT MAY 12, 2008

Present: Dianne Beals, Brenda Higgins, Earle Ferguson, Warren Blais, Ruth Blais, Paul Chaltas, Steve Higgins, Andrea Higgins, Dave Beasley, Steve LeBlanc, Eric Anderson, Eric Borman and Betty Bailey.

The meeting was opened with prayer and devotions by Earle Ferguson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as presented.

The Treasurer reported that the money from the men's and women's weekends are in and the insurance has been paid leaving a balance of over \$5000.00. His report was accepted as presented.

The Vice President reported that although he has contacted several men asking them to be rectors, he has not had an acceptance as yet.

Steve LeBlanc, rector for the spring weekend, reported that his auxiliaries did a great job and that the rollos were exemplary. In the future, there should be an announcement that no one is to leave during a rollo, and request that cell phones be shut off for the weekend. The essentials should be followed.

There appears to be a shortage of Pilgrim Guides. There needs to be an inventory of the trailer and unnecessary materials (such as Adventura materials) taken out. Inventory of the trailer should take place after each weekend. Brenda Higgins said Winnie Loan has volunteered to see to the upkeep of the trailer inventory.

Eric Borman is to attend International in Roswell, GA. A motion was made, seconded and passed for him to submit a bill for his expenses. He also may be going to Germany to conduct a workshop.

A proposal for RIMA Tres Dias to host the 2009 International Tri-annual Assembly was discussed, after which a motion was made, seconded and passed.

Judy Borman has been sending palanca regularly to other Tres Dias communities.

Post Weekend: Dianne has only received 4 corrected addresses for the mailing list. She will try o get the data base from Ann Marie and continue to try to update addresses.

Paul Chaltas will contact La Sallette regarding using their facilities for weekends and Steve LeBlanc will continue making phone calls looking for a suitable place. Sara Sabo has a place in Connecticut which he will investigate.

Brenda Higgins heeds contact phone numbers for her candidates. It was reported that we again have 2 suites for SDs at Cathedral Camp. It was also reported that there have been faxing problems and some applications were not received by her. Paul Chaltas and Cyndi Carroll are developing a protocol for the future. There is a need to pay attention to directions and have all instructions followed. They will report back to the July Tres Dias Secretariat meeting with results.

Membership in International this year is approximately \$64.00. We still need to work on incorporating in Massachusetts, Rhode Island or Connecticut. In Massachusetts, as a non-profit, there is only need to file with the Commonwealth. Paul Chaltas offered to check the web for more information.

The members present VOTED to suspend this meeting and resume on July 14, 2009 at 7:30 p.m., at which time the officers for the coming year will be elected.

Scripture Presenter for July 14<sup>th</sup> is Eric Borman.


