Presidents corner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At our Secretariat meeting on July 20th, we voted to approve the 'Amended and Restated Constitution and By-Laws of Tres Dias of Rhode Island-Massachusetts (RIMA) Inc. – Dated June 2015'. The vote was 19 in favor, 9 opposed, and 3 abstentions.

This governing document will allow us to work within the bounds of the new by-laws, and to conform to the requirements of Tres Dias International for chartering. It better defines, who we are and what we stand for.

There was some discussion regarding the procedure for voting at Secretariat meetings. Could it be managed differently, and could there be a provision for absentee ballots on critical issues in the future? A motion was made and carried to reconvene the By-laws committee to address this concern.

The Arent's and the Borman's recently returned from the annual Tres Dias International Assembly, this year held in Rockford, Illinois. Sue and I haven't been to an International event in many years, and I had forgotten how uplifting and joyous these events can be. The pescadores there were like friends in our own community; warm, friendly, loving, and willing to share their experiences and the way they do things in their communities. I kept thinking how wonderful it would be if folks in our community could share this kind of experience.

At about the same time, I received a request from the VP of Administration at TD International (Valerie Mehl), asking if RIMA would be willing to host an International Secretariat meeting in the Fall of either 2017 or 2018. An International Secretariat meeting is not as large as an Assembly, and consists of about 50 people from communities around the country. Valerie says, "It's pretty much like running a TD weekend. It's a lot less work than the Assembly."

Perhaps this is God's answer to having RIMA Pescadores experience the joy and encouragement embodied in a TD International event. So... At Monday's Secretariat the invitation to host this was discussed, and a motion was passed to have RIMA host the International Secretariat Meeting here, in 2017!
