Tres Dias and the Yellow Pages

Recently, I read an article on The Federalist website that struck a chord with me. The author was citing research that showed that church attendance was not falling but was in fact, rising. The impression of declining attendance was due to people, especially young people who were or are leaving mainline denomination churches. Contrary to popular belief, they were not giving up church or Christianity. The research showed that while people were leaving churches that were popular when people were relying on the Yellow Pages and listening to 8-track tapes, they are simply going elsewhere.

I think that sums up what we see and have been seeing in RIMA for a while now. We have had close to 1,000 Pescadores make a weekend in this community, yet at the last Weekend Opening I was the only Pescadore present who was not on Team and did not have a spouse on Team. Twenty Pescadores from the Community at a Closing is considered a good showing with about half of that number being spouses of team. The Mananita for the Fall Women's Weekend had 8 men present. EIGHT! Attendance at Secuelas is typically at similar levels to Closings; around 18 people. Of the 12 to 15 people that usually attend Secretariat, 10 are on the Weekend Committee. The vast majority of Pescadores in RIMA are not in a Reunion Group. In short, RIMA TD is a 4th day movement with hardly any participation in 4th Day activities. Other 4th Day movements like Walk to Emmaus have reported similar issues. In the last two years, two retreat centers in the MA/RI area have closed, further pointing to a decline in retreat demand.

For a long time in RIMA I would hear people say, "people only want to do the Weekend, they don't want to do the other stuff". It's hard to see how that is true anymore. In the past 2 or 3 years we've had to cancel 2 or 3 Weekends due to a lack of candidates and Team. Men's #72 has just 13 men on

Team; including SD's, Rector, and Chief. As of last Monday's Secretariat meeting we had no candidate applications. Last Fall's Men's Weekend had to be cancelled. This Fall's Men's Weekend has no Rector, yet...(?). It is the common experience of Rectors trying to get Team to contact over 100 Pescadores by phone, email, text, etc. Their most common response? No response. Repeated attempts yield only silence. When I hear about that kind of experience, I always have the same two thoughts: 1) They don't want to tell the Rector "No" and 2) They have something else that they would rather do. If they wanted to serve on Team, they would. If they wanted to come to the Opening or the Closing or the Mananita or the Secuela or the Team Critique presuming that they knew about them, they would.

I know some people work when some of these events are taking place. I know some care for sick family or are themselves sick. Others can't drive to events, etc... All of that brings me back to the initial point: I think that people in general, have moved on from TD / RIMA / 4th Day movements in the same way that people moved on from the Yellow Pages. For whatever reason, it doesn't fit into their lives anymore.

In the last 6 weeks, 3 different Pescadores have reached out to me with essentially the same question: Is RIMA over? Frankly, it's a question I've asked myself before.

I don't know the answer to that. But, I will say this; we're a lay led movement that exists to help guide new Pescadores through a 3 day "Weekend Experience" and into their 4th Day where they can be Christian leaders in all of their environments.

However, if you don't have new Pescadores or you can't put on a Weekend and virtually no one participates in the 4th Day, what are we doing here?

You tell me.

The sponsorship guidelines are the cover for a larger document from a workshop I attended at the last Tres Dias International Assembly. I think it's a good quick reference. I encourage everyone to read it and pray about sponsoring. We really need candidates for our up coming weekends!



SPONSORSHIP GUIDELINES SPIRIT OF GRACE TRES DIAS

IMPORTANCE OF SPONSORSHIP

- Sponsorship is one of the *essentials* of Tres Dias.
- Tres Dias is not a walk-in and sign up organization. It is by invitation only.
- Sponsorship is an act of *sacrificial love*.
- Sponsorship is an act of *spiritual warfare*.

WHOM SHOULD YOU SPONSOR

- Begin in prayer.
- Tres Dias is designed for *Christians*.
- Tres Dias is not for everyone.
- Those whom you should consider inviting:
 - o Church leaders
 - o Dependable church members
 - o Less active church members
 - Unchurched believers who are potential church members
 - o Unchurched Christians who are hungry for "something more"
- The following are *not* ideal candidates and you should not sponsor such a candidate without
 - much prayer and sound Christian counsel.
 - o Non-Christians (persons with no relationship to Jesus Christ's church)
 - o Persons undergoing a severe emotional crisis requiring professional counseling.
 - o Persons who repeatedly decline to make a weekend after being invited.
 - Persons looking for another "spiritual high" or another experience to help them "arrive."
 - Persons living in a non-Christian lifestyle.

HOW TO SPONSOR

- Start early (three to six months before the weekend)
- Consider making your invitation a special occasion.
- Avoid "spooking" with unnecessary secrecy, but save the surprises.
