Historian Report: Nothing to report

International Tres Dias Report: Meeting held in Phoenix, Arizona, November 2 to 4; Sue, Gordon, Judy, Eric attended; attended a "victory" secuela, which was attended by about 250 pescadores! Terms for officers were extended to 3 years.

Old Business:

Gordon will meet with Steve Crème and MaryBeth to complete transition from .com to .org

New Business:

1. Trailer Much difficulty with trailer prior to women's weekend. No working lights; no registration sticker (found and attached); Steve H installed temporary lights; hitch disconnected when hit pothole; left saving in street in front of Lynne's house,

but was hit (and run!) Able to confirm that it was a late model Toyota. Needed new tire and rim: Steve took care of that(\$193.00) and did transport it to the camp. Trailer is now in Steve's yard awaiting permanent electrical repairs. In addition, seals on roof need to be replaced, a spare tire needs to be purchased, and the hitch and frame need to be painted. Steve estimates costs in the \$400-500 range. Steve will undertake sealant work. Dale thinks son James will do electrical work for free. Dale will have James contact Steve.

Will need motion later to reimburse Steve for his expenses

Dale will look into storing trailer in her park

Eric will inquire about storing trailer at Cathedral Camp.

2. There was a tote in the small kitchen in the villa with materials for a confirmation class. Materials like our own; must have been packed inadvertently ; Michele (from Camp) will go to Steve's to try to locate tote; Eric will arrange communication.

3. Discussed poor community support of weekend (perhaps will become better when new lists are used)

4. Need to discuss problem of financial aid in weekend committee.

5. Amelia has conflict on the 8th. Decided to request food or toy at Secuela to donate to Salvation Army; Brunch or dinner to be decided.

6. Sue would like lists of other communities holding weekends included in Corresponding Secretary's report so that the community can pray for them

7. Corresponding Secretary (can be reappointed), Secretary (can be reappointed for 3 years) and Vice President positions are up for nomination in January. Nominations so far include Judy Borman for Corresponding Secretary, Dale Goulden for Secretary, and Dawn Rota for Vice President. Eric will send info to Lynne to be included in the Butterfly to open nominations to the community.

Community

A few months ago I reported some things that transpired at the Tres Dias International Secretariat, mainly that our objective be "to build communities, not weekends." This makes so much sense to me because without community, weekends can't happen. And without weekends, RIMA cannot survive! That's what I see happening to our RIMA community.

One of my daily devotions* prompted me to write this article. The devotion was based on Ecclesiastes 4:8-12: (I am using verses 8-12)

Two are better than one,

because they have a good return for their labor:

¹⁰ If either of them falls down,

one can help the other up.

But pity anyone who falls

and has no one to help them up.

¹¹ Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm.
But how can one keep warm alone?

¹² Though one may be overpowered,
two can defend themselves.
A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

I am going to use excerpts from the devotion that spoke to me regarding RIMA and our need for community.

“Community is not a “nice-to-have” addition, but an essential experience for living a godly and healthy life. God intended for humans to have rich, life-giving relationships with each other; relationships energized and motivated by the actual presence of God among them.”
RIMA cannot exist without community – it is essential for a healthy existence. Without it, we die! I get discouraged by the lack of community at openings and closings, and at Secuelas, but every time I am with fellow Pescadores, whether at a Secretariat meeting, a committee meeting, a Secuela or at a team meeting I am encouraged and uplifted. And I think, yes, we can survive and become vibrant once again.

Another excerpt:

“One of the marked differences between the church and the rest of society is the call to live for others. Throughout the New Testament, followers of Jesus were urged to look out for “one another.” When the early Christians did this in faith, it created an irresistible attraction for outsiders to belong to the family of God.”

Our call as Pescadores in our 4th Day is to be there for the Pilgrims/ Candidates and the new Pescadores. And we can't do that unless we: bond into a community and respond to Rectors' calls to serve on team, attend Secuelas, belong to a Reunion Group, sponsor candidates, attend Openings and Closings, send palanca, serve a meal, etc. In other words, act like a community of Christians serving the Lord. We all know Tres Dias is the Lord's way of reaching others and the weekends are His. He needs our help!

One last excerpt:

“There are days we desperately need a good hug to keep going, and other days we need a swift kick in the pants to get back to where we should be.”

It is my prayer that this article will serve as both that hug and the swift kick! Please don't let RIMA die!

To be a Secuela, there must be a 4th Day speaker – someone who shares something from their 4th Day – and floating reunion groups. The number of groups depends upon the number of Pescadores at the Secuela, but they are usually 4-6 people who discuss a question provided for the groups. Just like on a weekend, no one *must* participate in the discussions.

RIMA Secuelas are Open, meaning non Pescadores may attend. It's a good place to bring a potential candidate/Pilgrim. They will not only hear the 4th Day speaker, they will meet others who will share their testimony. Invite church members, friends and/or family. It's a good way to build community.
